#### DISTRICT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

## **PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS**

Each district in its District Parental Policy must establish the district's expectations for parental involvement. [section 1118(a)(2),ESEA.]

<u>Belmont Charter School and Inquiry Charter School</u> agree to implement the following statutory requirements:

- The Schools will put into operation programs, activities and procedures for the involvement of parents in all of its schools, consistent with section 1118 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), Title I, Part A programs. Those programs, activities and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.
- Consistent with section 1118, the School District will work with its schools to ensure that the required school-level parental involvement policies meet the requirements of sections 1118(b) of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1118(d) of the ESEA.

  - Parental involvement means the participation of parents in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring----

  - (C) That parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child;
  - (D) The carrying out of other activities, such as those described in section 1118 of the ESEA.

The School will inform parents and parental organizations of the purpose and existence of the Parental Information and Resource Center in the State.

- 1. The <u>Belmont & Inquiry Charter Schools</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school-wide parental involvement plan under section 1112 of the ESEA:

- Parent chaperones for field trips.

The <u>Belmont Charter School</u> will coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies in Title I, Part A with parental involvement strategies under the following other programs: *Head Start* 

4. The Belmont & Inquiry Charter Schools will take the following action to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in order to assess its impact on family engagement in Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities. The School will use the findings to the evaluation about its parental involvement policy and activities to design strategies for more effective parental involvement, and to revise, if necessary (and with the involvement of parents) its parental involvement policies.

- B. The <u>Belmont & Inquiry Charter Schools</u> will, with assistance, provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training, and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement by:
  - Monthly parent events
  - Tutoring with students
  - Homework Help
  - *Lending Library*
  - Classroom visits allowed with appointment
  - Bring your parent to school day
  - PowerSchool: parents have online access to their students assignments/success through Pearson software
  - Training for PowerSchool available at report card conferences & back-toschool night
  - Available public access computers at each school
  - PSSA workshops
  - Preparing parents ahead of time for the expectations/standards for their students
- C. The <u>Belmont & Inquiry Charter Schools</u> will, with assistance, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate with parent programs and build ties between parents and school by:
  - Professional Development
  - Monthly Parent Events
  - Behavior sheets; written communication between parents & teachers
  - Individual Voicemails for teachers
  - Teachers text/email with parents
  - BACS: Parents must sign their child out of his/her classroom
- D. The <u>Belmont & Inquiry Charter Schools</u> will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and

activities with Head Start and other programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children by:

- Monthly parent events
- Parent Workshops
- Tutoring with students
- Homework Help
- Lending Library (3 year olds-K) & Sustained Silent Reading (1-8)
- Classroom visits allowed with appointment
- Bring your parent to school day
- PowerSchool: parents have online access to their students assignments/success through Pearson software
- E. The <u>Belmont Charter School</u> will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that the parents can understand:
  - Mandarin & Spanish speaking staff available for families that need them.

## PART III. DISTRICT WIDE PARENTAL INVOVLEMENT POLICY COMPONENTS
